Recent wins

Brewarrina Shire Council - Brewarrina Aboriginal Fish Traps (Baiame's Ngunnhu)

Andrew Krause successfully prepared and submitted a funding application on behalf of Brewarrina Shire Council, securing \$350,000 from the Federal Department of Industry, Science and Resources (DISR) under round 7 of the Australian Heritage Grants Program 2024-25.

This funding will support the management, conservation, and public engagement efforts for the Brewarrina Aboriginal Fish Traps (Baiame's Ngunnhu) — a site listed on Australia's National Heritage List and believed to be one of the oldest known man-made structures on Earth, with estimates dating back 40,000 years.

The project will be implemented over the 2024-25 to 2026-27 financial years, ensuring the protection and promotion of the site's national heritage values. Projence will maintain an ongoing role in the project's delivery.

AGL Macquarie - Bayswater Power Station

Projence is providing a site-based civil project engineer to support AGL Macquarie with ash management projects.

Projence's scope includes design and construction interface management, contractor management, cost, scheduling and quality management, and management of statutory requirements.

Snowy Hydro - Hunter Power Project


Projence is providing construction management and project engineering support to Snowy Hydro on the Hunter Power Project.

The Hunter Power Project at Kurri Kurri will fill the gap in electricity demand and ensure security of supply.

MACH Energy - South Dam Civil Works

Projence is providing site-based project engineering and project management support to Peabody Energy to support the civil construction phase of of their South Dam Project.

Projence's scope includes project management, contractor management for civil construction and HSEQ, governance, commercial and scheduling management, and technical support.

Warrumbungle Shire Council - Grant Applications - Legacy Infrastructure Fund

Projence is proud to have assisted Warrumbungle Shire Council in submitting applications valued at \$11.25 million through the EnergyCo Legacy Infrastructure Fund (LIF), part of the NSW Government's commitment to providing long-term infrastructure benefits in the Central-West Orana Renewable Energy Zone (REZ).

Our scope of work included:

- Conducting preliminary assessments and building a strategic application approach
- Engaging with stakeholders to align project goals with community needs
- Preparing detailed grant application submissions for 4 Legacy Infrastructure Projects

The Legacy Infrastructure Fund is designed to improve community liveability, connectivity, and regional economic resilience by funding projects that deliver long-term benefits, such as enhanced health services, housing, and community infrastructure. This initiative, administered by the Department of Climate Change, Energy, Environment, and Water, exemplifies how targeted investment can drive regional development and resilience.

Projence is excited to play a part in shaping a sustainable future for the Central-West Orana REZ and looks forward to potential roles in bringing these transformative projects to life.


Living the values
