

Brewarrina Shire Council - Landfill Application Grants

Projence is providing grant writing support to Brewarrina Shire Council for Landfill Consolidation and Environmental Improvements This program is for local councils in regional New South Wales.

This \$12 million program helps regional councils address potential liabilities posed by landfill activities, reduce environmental risks, and contribute to the long-term protection of the environment.

RGDC - Moree Rail Operations Report

Projence has been engaged to review rail sidings operations at Moree Special Activation Precinct and prepare a report setting out a preferred option.

The scope includes reviewing previous reports, assessing the current freight demand, and reviewing and preparing cost estimates.

Constructive Solutions - Newell Highway Realignment


Projence has been engaged to provide site surveillance support to the owner's project management team for the Newell Highway Realignment near Parkes, NSW.

The strategic review aims to update compliance with legislative requirements and new financial modelling provided by the client. The project officer support is a relief role providing site supervision for roads projects in the Walgett Shire.









Project highlight

Orange City Council Sports Precinct

Projence is proud to be contributing to the delivery of the Orange Sports Precinct, a major regional infrastructure project that will transform local sport and recreation facilities.

The NSW Government has committed \$59.5 million, with the Australian Government providing an additional \$15 million to help bring this vision to life.

Located at the Bloomfield precinct between existing sportsgrounds and the Orange Health Service, the project includes new stadiums, upgraded roads, and extensive new facilities to support local sport and major events.

One of the centrepieces of the development is the 1300 seat John Davis Stadium grandstand, set to become one of the largest in the Central West, thanks to additional federal funding.

Projence's scope of work includes:

- Huntley Road upgrade
- Forest Road upgrade
- Construction of over 800 car park spaces
- 1300 seat grandstand
- Synthetic athletics track
- Eight new playing fields
- Comprehensive landscaping

We're excited to help deliver this landmark precinct that will serve the Orange community for generations to come.


